Detailed Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival in Kathmandu(1400m)

Welcome to Nepal! Upon arrival at Tribhuvan International Airport, make your way to your hotel in Kathmandu (self-transfer). In the evening 5 PM, join us at the Hawk's Eye Travels office for a short pre-trek briefing to go over the itinerary, permits, and any final preparations for your upcoming adventure.

Day 2: Kathmandu Sightseeing - Cultural Heritage Tour

After breakfast, start your guided Kathmandu Valley sightseeing tour, exploring the heart of Nepal’s rich culture, art, and history. Visit Pashupatinath Temple, one of the holiest Hindu temples in the world, dedicated to Lord Shiva. Next, explore Boudhanath Stupa, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the largest Buddhist stupas in Nepal. Continue to Swayambhunath (Monkey Temple), perched atop a hill, where you can enjoy panoramic views of Kathmandu Valley while discovering ancient Buddhist shrines and intricate architecture. Finally, visit Patan Durbar Square, renowned for its Newar architecture, historic palaces, temples, and courtyards.

Day 3: Drive from Kathmandu to Pokhara (827m) 6-7 hours

Begin your scenic journey from Kathmandu to Pokhara, one of Nepal's most picturesque cities. The drive takes approximately 6 to 7 hours, passing through lush valleys, terraced hills, and charming rural villages, offering plenty of opportunities for photography and short stops along the way. Upon arrival in Pokhara, check into your hotel and take some time to relax and refresh. In the evening, enjoy a leisurely stroll along Phewa Lake, soaking in the serene waters and the stunning reflection of the Annapurna mountains.

Day 4: Pokhara Sightseeing Tour

Start your day early with a drive to Sarangkot, a popular hilltop viewpoint, to witness a breathtaking sunrise over the Annapurna and Machhapuchhre (Fishtail) mountain ranges. The panoramic views of the snow-capped peaks and Pokhara Valley are truly unforgettable and perfect for photography enthusiasts. After sunrise, return to Pokhara and continue your sightseeing tour. Visit Davis Falls, a unique waterfall with a mysterious underground stream, followed by Gupteshwor Cave, famous for its sacred Shiva Lingam and intriguing rock formations. Next, explore the dramatic Seti Gorge, carved by the Seti River, showcasing nature's power and beauty.

Day 5: Drive to Chitwan National Park (415m) 5 hours

After breakfast, embark on a scenic drive from Pokhara to Chitwan National Park, approximately 5 hours through lush valleys, rivers, and rural landscapes. Chitwan is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of Nepal's premier wildlife destinations, renowned for its rich biodiversity and thriving ecosystems. Upon arrival, check into your hotel or jungle lodge and take some time to relax and refresh. In the evening, experience the vibrant Tharu cultural program, featuring traditional dances, music, and folk performances that showcase the heritage of the indigenous Tharu community.

Day 6: Jungle safari and wildlife activities in Chitwan

Today is dedicated to adventure and wildlife exploration in Chitwan National Park, one of Nepal's most famous conservation areas. Begin with an early morning jungle walk or jeep safari, where you may spot one-horned rhinoceroses, deer, wild boars, and a variety of exotic birds in their natural habitat. Next, enjoy a canoe ride along the Rapti River, offering a peaceful way to observe crocodiles, waterfowl, and other riverine wildlife. Continue your exploration with a visit to the Elephant Breeding Center, where you can learn about the park's conservation efforts and interact with these gentle giants. The day also includes birdwatching opportunities, as Chitwan is home to more than 500 species of birds, making it a paradise for nature enthusiasts.

Day 7: Drive to Lumbini - The Birthplace of Lord Buddha (150m)

After breakfast, embark on a scenic drive to Lumbini, the sacred birthplace of Lord Buddha and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Upon arrival, check into your hotel and prepare for a day of spiritual exploration and cultural discovery. Visit the Maya Devi Temple, the exact site where Lord Buddha was born, and explore the Sacred Garden surrounding it. Don't miss the Ashoka Pillar, erected by Emperor Ashoka to commemorate his visit, and learn about its historical and spiritual significance. Lumbini is home to international monasteries built by Buddhist communities from countries such as Japan, Thailand, Myanmar, and Sri Lanka.

Day 8: Drive back to Kathmandu

After breakfast, begin your journey back to Kathmandu, retracing the scenic routes through Nepal's picturesque valleys and countryside. The drive allows you to soak in the last glimpses of rural landscapes, rivers, and terraced hills before returning to the bustling capital. Depending on your flight schedule, you may have some time for last-minute shopping, picking up souvenirs, handicrafts, or traditional Nepalese items from local markets. Finally, you will be transferred to Tribhuvan International Airport for your onward journey, carrying with you beautiful memories of Nepal's culture, heritage, natural beauty, and spiritual experiences.

Inclusions:

- Accommodation in Kathmandu: 3 nights at a standard hotel on a twin-sharing, bed and breakfast basis.
- Accommodation in Pokhara: 2 nights at a standard hotel on a twin-sharing, bed and breakfast basis.
- Accommodation in Chitwan: 2 nights at a standard hotel or resort on a twin-sharing, full board plan (breakfast, lunch, and dinner included).
- Chitwan National Park Safari: All jungle safari activities and nature excursions as outlined in the itinerary.
- Accommodation in Lumbini: 2 nights at a standard hotel on a twin-sharing, bed and breakfast basis.
- Ground Transportation: All transfers and sightseeing in a private tourist vehicle (Car, Jeep, Van, Coaster, or Suttlej, depending on group size).
- Professional Guide: An experienced English-speaking guide for the entire tour.
- Farewell Dinner: Complimentary dinner at a traditional Nepali restaurant featuring cultural dance performances.

- Nepal entry visa fees: currently USD 30 for 15 days, USD 50 for 30 days, and USD 125 for a 90-day visa (payable on arrival).

- Entrance fees to temples, monasteries, and other sightseeing attractions.

Best time for the Yala Peak Climbing

The Kathmandu Pokhara Chitwan and Lumbini Tour is a year-round experience, but the ideal seasons to visit Nepal are spring (March to May) and autumn (September to November).

- Spring (March–May): With mild temperatures and blooming rhododendrons across the hills and valleys, spring is perfect for exploring Kathmandu’s heritage sites, enjoying boating in Pokhara, and experiencing Chitwan’s wildlife safaris.
- Autumn (September–November): After the monsoon, the skies are clear and crisp, offering breathtaking Himalayan vistas. Autumn is the most popular tourist season, ideal for photography, sightseeing, and outdoor adventures.



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
